- STANDARD LIGHT BULBS WASTE AROUND 90% OF THEIR ELECTRICAL ENERGY in heating the filament, which is why bulbs are hot to touch. ‘Compact Fluorescent Bulbs (CFLs), the new curly-cue type, are one of the simplest and most effective energy saving tools available – lasting on average ten times longer and using substantially less energy (e.g., a 20-watt CFL can replace a 75-watt traditional bulb) which helps to reduce power plant emissions of greenhouse gases. Since their efficiency comes from absence of requiring heat in order to produce light, a CFL bulb can last 10,000 hours (versus standard 750 hours) and thus is also significantly less costly to purchase over the long run.
